Did you know ...
Tu means “you” when speaking informally and for one person.
In English we need two words to say “put on” but in French we only need one – “mets”
Although “trousers” is plural in English – *some trousers*, in French, pantalon is singular - *un pantalon*

New Vocabulary revisit Year 4	
Yes and no	Oui et non
Colours – to read and write	rose – pink orange – orange brun – brown blanc – white noir – black violet – purple
Verb – put on	je mets- I put on tu mets- you put on tu mets..? – Are you putting on..?
Clothing	un pantalon- trousers un tee-shirt -t-shirt un chapeau - hat un pull - jumper une culotte – shorts

Just like in English je and tu (I and you) are pronouns

There are two groups of nouns in French – feminine and masculine.

Un is « a » for masculine noun.

Helpful hints

In “mets” both t and s are silent so we pronounce it “meh”
Oui is pronounced /wee/ as a combination of /oo/ and /ee/
